Information and applications are available after February each year through guidance counselors at their high school and Brunswick Community College, or from the Chief Nursing Officer's office at the hospital.

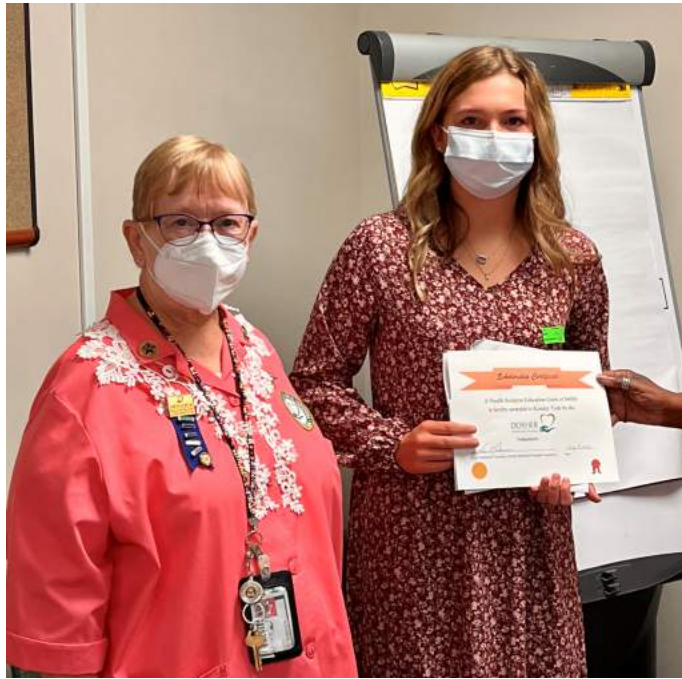
